

What is NORMAL?

It is important to know your horse's baselines.

Temperature: 99.0F to 101.0F

Pulse: 30 - 44 beats per minute.

Respiration: 8-16 breaths per minute.

Mucous Membrane Color: (color of gum tissue in mouth) Should be **pink** and **moist**.

CRT: (Capillary Refill Time - amount of time it takes for the color to return to gum tissue adjacent to the teeth after pressing and releasing your thumb). Usually **less than 2 seconds**.

GI Motility: (Gastrointestinal) Use a stethoscope or ear to flank - all four quadrants should have **3-4 sounds per minute**.

Movement: Is your horse walking and trotting as sound as normal? Can your horse turn its head easily in all directions?

Water and food consumption: A horse may drink **8-20 gallons of water/day**. Foals - watch mare for dripping milk, as this can be a sign the foal is not nursing. Lactating mares may need additional water.

Manure: Horses may defecate every 3-4 hours. Is your horse's manure its normal consistency? Is your horse's tail wet from diarrhea?

Urine: Frequency may differ depending on water intake/exercise - it is normal during the winter for urine to be red tinged after it mixes with snow.
